


# COMPASSIONATE COMMUNITIES

According to the international Charter for Compassion, compassionate communities are those that invest "actions, time, and resources" to promote peace, kindness, and happiness. The process of creating a compassionate community involves creating one that "works for all life." The Charter also states that a compassionate community is an "uncomfortable" community.
